- A thorough working knowledge of standard forms of contract such as the JCLI forms of contract.
- The ability to use hand drawings to express ideas allowing you to communicate ideas / solutions both in-house and externally without the need to turn to the computer for graphic support. Hand drawings should be used to establish principles before turning to CAD.
- Experience with 'Keyscape' would also be beneficial.

The ideal candidate will either be a recently Chartered Member of the Landscape Institute or a Landscape Architect working towards Chartered status. Candidates should have experience of running projects on site, should demonstrate a broad range of skills and abilities, and have experience of design at all levels including concept designs, sketch designs, masterplanning and detailed layout design.

Technical ability and good plant knowledge is also required, as is experience of preparing specifications and construction details. An interest in urban design / masterplanning would also be desirable and you should also have experience and an understanding of the detailed process involved in preparing Landscape and Visual Impact Assessments (LVIA).
